WOMEN'S ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT STATISTICS:

In Australia*:

- Women account for 1 in 5 (19%) board members in publicly listed companies
- Women hold nearly 1 in 4 (26%) of positions on boards in private sector organisations
- **70.5%** of women are in the workforce, a relatively **high participation rate** however Australia has a **low percentage of women on boards at 12.3%**
- **8.9% of female employees** in Australia are in **management** positions
- Australia has a gender pay gap of 18%, and is ranked 16th of the 22 countries listed by the OECD
- Australian women in fulltime work earn approximately \$15,000 less per year than men
- Women retire with just over **half the superannuation** savings of men
- One in two mothers report experiencing discrimination as a result of pregnancy, parental leave and return to work
- 26.7% of all Federal Parliamentary seats are held by women
- Women in Australia spend nearly twice as much time (1.8%) as men on unpaid work
- Only **14% of women enrolling in university** chose **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) **related fields**
- Australia is placed third in the world in higher education attainment for women, with 26.1% of women achieving a bachelor degree or equivalent.



According to McKinsey Global Institute – The Power of Parity report:

- A \$12 to \$28 trillion increase to the GDP in 2025 by bridging the gender gap
- 40 out of 95 countries have high or extremely high inequality on half or more indicators
- 75% of global unpaid work is done by women
- 240 million workers potentially added through higher female participation
- 1 million+ girls not born each year due to sex selective abortion
- Women make up 22% of ministerial and parliamentary roles in the world
- 30% of women have been victims of domestic violence
- Approximately 61% of unpaid care work is routine household chores
- Sweden offers **480 days of parental leave**
- 42% of women don't have a bank account
- 155 countries have at least one law impeding women's economic empowerment.

WEP Where women stand – Equality means business report:

- An estimated **70% of women** are represented in the world's poor
- An estimated **72% of the world's 33 million refugees** are women and children
- **Every minute** somewhere in the world a **woman dies** due to complications during pregnancy and childbirth.
